



Durham Sports Commission One Team, One Durham Fund

Q: What is the One Team, One Durham (1T1D) Fund?

A: The 1T1D Fund is 100% privately funded and is for the purpose of providing financial assistance to support youth sports in the areas of:

- Leadership development
- Pay for participation in leagues, membership, and organization fees
- Access to non-traditional sport opportunities

Q: Who's eligible to receive a grant to support youth sports?

A: Organizations that provide youth sport opportunities and:

- 501c3
- Operate and or based in Durham

Q: How does an organization apply for a grant?

A: An organization applies for a grant by completing and submitting an online form ([link](#)) at least 45 days prior to when the funds are needed.

Q: What is the maximum grant awarded to a youth sport participant?

A: The maximum grant awarded can be \$200 per youth sport participant. Please note: An organization can apply for up to a \$1,000 grant (5 youth sport participants)

Q: What can the grants be used for?

A: The grants are designed to assist in the following areas:

- Camp Fees
- Private Sports Lesson Fees
- Registration Fees
- Sports Equipment
- Sports Travel Costs

Q: What is the definition of a camp?

A: A camp is defined as informal and formal activities for youth. The activities can range from individual skill development to team competition.

Q: What is the definition of a private sports lesson?

A: A private sports lesson is one on one or small group instruction in a specific sport. Participants can receive direct feedback, coaching, and instruction.

Q: What are registration fees?

A: Registration fees are costs associated with joining a sports team, league, organization, and other affiliated groups.

Q: What is sports equipment?

A: Sports equipment is any type of equipment needed to participate in a particular sport. Examples: Bats, Balls, Cleats, Fishing Rods, Golf Clubs, Shoes, Tennis Racquets

Q: What are sports travel costs?

A: Sports travel costs are costs associated with the team, organization, and/or individual traveling to an out-of-town destination with the purpose of competing in a game, match, meet, tournament, etc....

Q: Will the team, league, organization be required to complete a final grant report?

A: Yes. The final grant report must include the following:

- How the grant funds were used
- Total number of participants
- Total number of participants impacted by the fund
- Age Range
- Gender, Race, and Ethnicity
- Household Type
- Academic/Grade Level
- Programming Area
- Dates/Duration
- Future plans to continue the programming
- Feedback from the participants and their families
- Photos or videos from that include participants impacted by the fund
